Lots of young people worry about their privacy around sexual health. So, what are your rights? Here are some good things to know.

At the clinic:

When you get to a healthcare clinic, the receptionist will need to ask you some questions. These could include your name, contact details and appointment type.

All the personal and health information you give the clinic is confidential by law, which means nobody else can see it. (Any exceptions to this will be discussed with you first.)

Medicare

The clinic may also ask if you have a Medicare card. Your Medicare card is a green plastic card, that lets you receive lots of medical services at no or low cost. If your family are Australian citizens, you probably already have a Medicare account on your family's card.

From age 14, no one else can see your Medicare records without your permission – not even your parents, partners or friends. You have your own private records even if you do not have your own card.

You can get your own Medicare card from age 15. To do that, you'll need to go to a Medicare service centre. They will ask you to show some identity documents (such as a student card or birth certificate), and to fill in some forms.

If you do not have a Medicare card, you can still access sexual healthcare. Where you can go may depend on the clinic, and if you have any private health insurance cover.

My Health Record

If you are under 18, your parents or guardians may have registered you for a My Health record. **Once you turn 14, you can take control of your My Health record** from your parent or guardian by calling the helpline: 1800 723 471.

Remember, it's your health and your choice.
